Variance Guidelines for Facilities Impacted by 2016 Flood

Formal variance application procedures are being waived for facilities which anticipate the need to bring in one or more stationary internal combustion engines rated ≥ 400 brake horsepower (298 kW). However, the Linn County Air & Water Quality Branch will request the following information be provided:

1. Number of generator(s)
2. kW of generator(s)
3. Location
4. Duration
